We believe in baptism by immersion as a symbol of receiving the new birth and a new life through Christ. Matthew 28:19,20; John 3:5; Romans 6:16

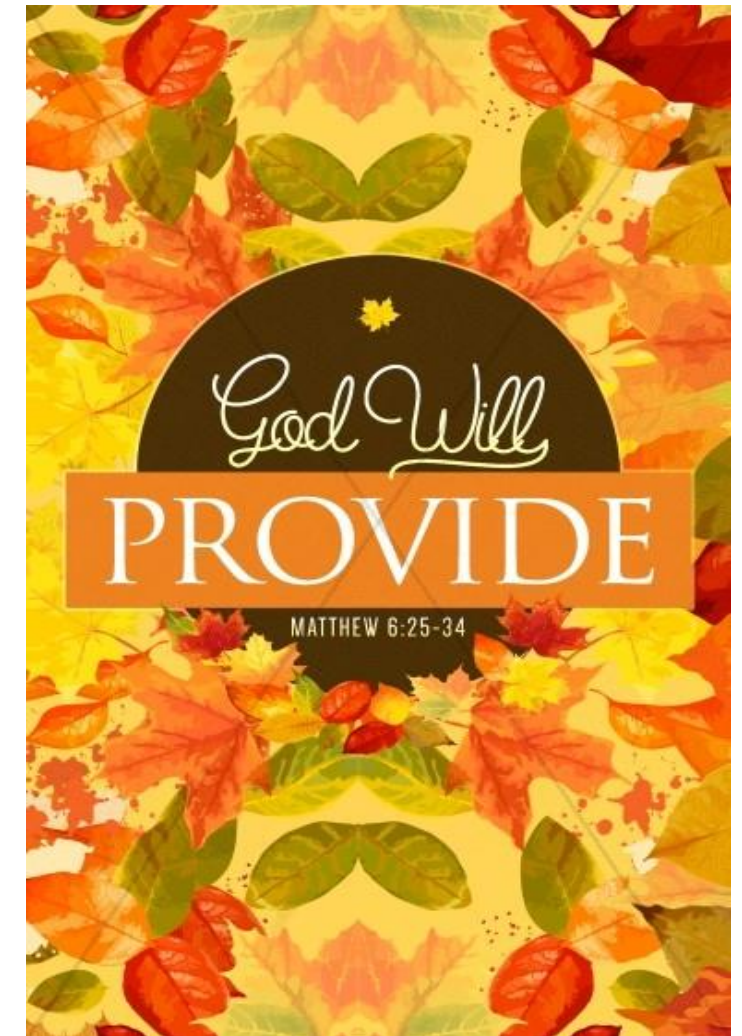
