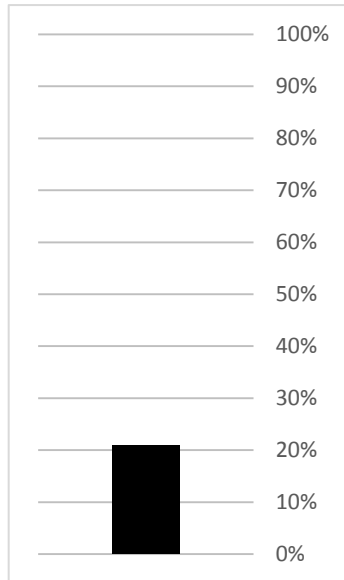
Church Christmas Program—“Glory to God in the Highest”, our

December is catch up month for the Church Family Budget. The amount to be raised is \$68,189.72. We have raised 14,196.28 so far. We use our fellowship hall for many functions including piano recitals, Vegetarian Tasting, Vegetarian Dinner Club, CHIP, Valentines parties and many other gatherings. When you walk in to have a meal the paper table cloths are there along with the soap for the dishwasher, the plates and bowls for the food and even trash bags to dispose of the plates afterward. Any group that uses the Fellowship hall will find these items available to them at no charge. This room is kept fully stocked and ready to use from

funds in the Church Family Budget. Every month (and sometimes more than once a month) the supplies are replenished so that it is ready for your use. Thanks for supporting the Church Family Budget which allows us to have all these different functions along with the Fellowship Meals.

We believe in baptism by immersion as a symbol of receiving the new birth and a new life through Christ. Matthew 28:19,20; John 3:5; Romans 6:16

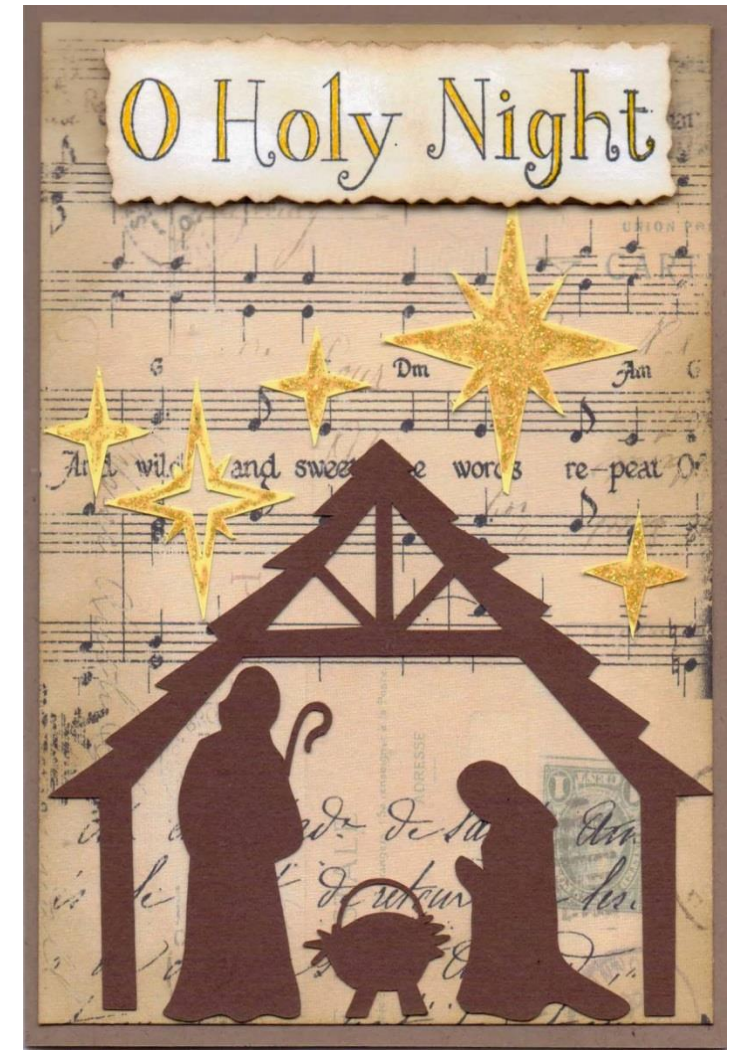
